Founded as a street newspaper in 2003, we offer economic opportunities to people experiencing homelessness through media that elevates voices and encourages debate on poverty and injustice. We are very flexible about starting and ending dates as we work with interns from a variety of different schools and with a variety of different needs and schedules. We unfortunately cannot offer a salary, but our interns are eligible to receive a supplemental Rebele stipend of up to \$5,000.
